



Men's Competitions Rules & Format 2024

- 1. Dress for all rounds up to the final for both players and markers (arranged by the challenger) will be white above the waist, grey trousers and regulation bowling shoes.
- 2. The first named on the draw sheet is the **CHALLENGER**, **WHO MUST**, within a week of the start of the round, offer two reasonable dates to the opponent. If the challenger fails to do so, the opponent should offer 2 dates to the challenger. If a date cannot then be agreed, the challenger forfeits the match.
- 3. Entry of matches in the rink booking diary must be made on the <u>rink request</u> <u>slips</u> to be found at the beginning of the diary on the men's notice board desk.
- 4. The <u>closing date</u> for each round will be shown on the draw sheet. **Extensions** to the deadline are at the discretion of the Competition Secretary and must be approved.
- 5. All singles competitions (except Top 40) should have a marker. If one cannot be found then players should contact the Comp Sec who will assist in finding a marker, agree a new date or allow an extension. Markers can be men or women.
- 6. If the player/team is unable to fulfil the match by closing date the player/team will concede the match and indicate this by completing a scorecard showing that the match has been conceded and placing it in the competition result box.
- 7. The winning player/s of each match should write their name on the draw sheet, and place signed score card in the result box at the end of the men's notice board desk.
- Having entered various competitions, you then realise you are not going to be available to play on FINALS WEEKEND (14/15th SEPTEMBER) please tell the Competition Secretary immediately. PLEASE DO NOT PLAY A COUPLE OF ROUNDS BEFORE YOU SCRATCH.

Friday Evening is Aggregate Night (Club Night). No club competitions may be played on a Friday evening after 6.00pm. Competitions started before 6.00pm and not finished by this time must resume on another day.

Championship Singles - 21 shots

Handicap Singles - 21 shots for the lower handicapped player; 21 shots plus the difference between handicaps for the higher handicapped player

Two Wood Singles - 21 ends. The competition will be run on one day, which will also include the Ladies, to alleviate the necessity of markers and applying for rink allocation. **The competition will take place on Sunday 4th August.**

Top Forty - 10 ends. 4 bowls. It is a mixed handicapped competition (50% of handicap applies and added to card before start), Play to the jack as cast no marker needed.

100 up Singles - First to 100 points. Shot wood = 4 pts, 2nd = 3 pts, 3rd = 2 pts 4th = 1pt. If scores are equal after 20 ends then extra end(s) will be played until there is an outright winner.

Veteran's Singles - for members aged 65 and over. 21 shots plus the addition of the difference between handicaps for the highest handicapped player.

West Wickham & Hayes Singles - For members with a handicap of minus six or below 21 shots.

Mixed Handicap Drawn Pairs - 18 ends for all rounds up to the final; 21 ends in the final Difference in handicap to go on scoreboard at the start of the game but no ends.

Men's Handicap Drawn Pairs - 18 ends for all rounds up to the final; 21 ends in the final Difference in handicap to go on scoreboard at the start of the game but no ends.

Friday Night Mixed Aggregate - Please check what time discs are down, as this varies throughout the latter part of the season.

Leon Rose - This is a Mixed Triples Handicap Competition, which will be played on Sunday 23rd June. The Ladies' & the Men's Competition Secretary will draw the teams and try to balance the Handicaps as near as possible.
